



CROP and Scholars Programs' Partnership Activities 2015-2016

- 96 students attended Fall 2015 Eagle Expo – one student received a scholarship from Admissions
- 495 students from 35 schools attended 'College for a Day' programs on FGCU campus
- 26 11th-grade students attended the Outreach Programs' residential summer camp
- 18 middle school students participated in the Outreach Programs' residential summer camp
- 63 high school students attended the Flight Leadership Program at FGCU presented by FGCU's MLD LEAD Team

CROP and Scholars Senior Data

- 3.4 GPA was the average of students within the programs (2014-15 school year)
- 92% of the Outreach Programs' seniors completed the financial aid form for a Pell Grant (2014-15 school year)
- 96% applied for post-secondary education with assistance from the FGCU Outreach Programs staff (2014-15 school year)
- 93% of the graduating CROP Seniors were in some form of post-secondary (2014-15 school year)
- 84% of the graduating Scholars Seniors were in some form of post-secondary (2014-15 school year)
- 15 of the CROP/Scholars Seniors enrolled at Florida Gulf Coast University (2014-15 school year)

College Reach Out Program

- 503 students participated in the College Reach Out Program for the 2015-2016 academic year
- 113 middle school students & 389 high school students in the four-county area
- 127 graduating high school seniors from the CROP Program
- 24 College Outreach Programs were served in public schools

Scholars Program

- 512 students participated in the Scholars Program for the 2015-2016 academic year
- 325 high school students & 187 elementary & middle school students in the five-county area
- 104 graduating high school seniors from the Scholars Program
- 37 Scholars Programs were served in public schools & social service programs
