Student Conduct Committee

The Student Conduct Committee was established in 2003 as the University Judicial Board. This body hears cases, determines responsibility, and recommends sanctions to the Dean of Students. The Committee is comprised of trained students, staff, and faculty of FGCU. Since 2005, this hearing body has processed 87 cases.

Academic Integrity Committee

This committee was established in 2008 and is comprised of faculty and student representatives from all of the colleges within the University. To date, one case has been heard by this committee.
