Beginning August 1, 2011, the GRE test was newly revised. Mrs. Propert was selected to attend training on the new test in Atlanta, April 2011, sponsored by Educational Testing Services. Both of our instructors have carefully revised the Fall 2011 GRE review course to align with the new test.

The Verbal Reasoning section places a greater emphasis on higher-level cognitive skills, better measuring your ability to understand what you read and how you apply those skills. The Quantitative Reasoning section still requires basic math skills. However, there will be increased emphasis on data interpretation and real-life scenarios. ### **INSTRUCTORS:**

Sue Ann Propert A New Jersey native, Mrs. Propert earned a BA in English from Rider University and an MAT from Trenton State University. She has been teaching American Literature and writing on the high school and college levels for 35 years and has been preparing students of Lee, Collier, and Charlotte counties for the GRE and GMAT for 27 years. She and her husband and co-teacher, Jim, made a 10-hour video entitled *Secrets to Success on the SATs*, which aired on local cable stations. Mrs. Propert was named Lee County English Teacher of the Year in 1997, Florida English Teacher of the Year in 1998 and she earned her National Board Certification in 1999. Additionally, Sue has published two books and a set of flashcards to help students improve their vocabulary scores on standardized tests. The class of 2001 chose her with her husband, Jim, to give the commencement address.

Jim Propert Also from New Jersey, Jim Propert earned his BA in Mathematics from Lycoming College in Pennsylvania and his M.Ed. from the University of South Florida. He has been teaching all levels of mathematics for 31 years, the last 27 at Cape Coral High School where he coached its nationally recognized Math Team and where he implemented a preparation course for the quantitative section of the SAT. Mr. Propert has been preparing local college graduates for the GRE and GMAT for the past 22 years. He was named Lee County Math Teacher of the Year in 1993, Cape Coral Teacher of the Year in 1994, and the Phi Delta Kappa Educator of the year for K-12 in 2009. Mr. Propert was chosen by the 1996 graduates of Cape Coral High School as commencement speaker. Additionally, he was chosen by the class of 2001 to be commencement co-speaker with his wife Sue. Mr. Propert has just moved from Cape Coral High School to the district office as the new Lee County Coordinator of Secondary Mathematics.
